Based on the life of the author's own grandmother and written after almost three hundred interviews with those involved in the real-life scandal, *The Blue Orchard* is as elegant and moving as it is exact and convincing. It is a dazzling portrayal of the changes America underwent in the first fifty years of the twentieth century. Readers will be swept into a time period that in many ways mirrors our own. Verna Krone's story is ultimately a testament to the indomitable nature of the human spirit—and a reminder that determination and self-education can defy the social pressures that keep women and other disenfranchised groups down. Hidden from mortal eyes are the creatures of the darkness that coexist with mortals: Shadows, vampires, fallen angels, demons, shape shifters, succubi, and the like. Seventeen-year-old Amber enters their world by chance when her brother, Dallas, sets her up with a summer job in Scotland. Dallas has spied something in the woods he thinks could make them rich beyond their wildest dreams. Instead of finding riches, Amber unknowingly enters a paranormal race—and promptly wins the first prize—a prize that comes with no exchange policy, and for which many would kill. Soon, she discovers her new boss, Aidan, didn't even know her for her astounding housekeeping skills, and no one is who they say they are. But by that time she's far too deep into a world she never knew existed, a world of love bonds, dark magic, ancient enemies and immortals. As the dark forces slowly conspire against Amber, her naivety and love for Aidan catapults her into a calamitous series of otherworldly

events. With every immortal creature hunting for her, whom can she trust with her life? A JOB FROM HELL is the book in the Ancient Legends series. The sequel, Doomed, is out now. Maggie and Caleb are married, leaders of their people, parents to their children, and happier than they ever dreamed, even with the visions they saw of it to prevent. The council is still rebelling against Maggie's changes, but this time it's different. It's almost as if something...or someone is behind them, pulling the strings and making decisions for them. And Maggie is having strange visions only she can see, leaving Caleb helpless to help her. But when her visions start to warn her that their daughter, one day be in danger, they'll do anything it takes to find out what's going on and how to stop it, even paying a price as high as the previous Visionary. Maggie and Caleb must find out who or what is behind it all and stop them before Maggie is in a vision too late.
