Although Wolfgang Iser is one of the most influential literary theorists of the twentieth century, there is no authoritative study about his oeuvre. Mit der Festlegung auf diese Vorstellung von Literatur ist auch die Ausrichtung meiner Arbeit bestimmt. Sie wird sich am Erkenntnisinteresse der Psychologie als Wissenschaft orientieren, da diese den gleichen Gegenstand wie die Literatur hat: das innere Erleben und äußere Verhalten des Menschen. [...] Mia Holl lives in a state governed by The Method, where good health is the highest duty of the citizen. Everyone must submit medical data and sleep records to the authorities on a monthly basis, and regular exercise is mandatory. Mia is young and beautiful, a successful scientist who is outwardly obedient but with an intellect that marks her as subversive. Convinced that her brother has been wrongfully convicted of a terrible crime, Mia comes up against the full force of a regime determined to control every aspect of its citizens' lives. bestenfalls, was er getan hat.« Diese Erkenntnis im Kopf lässt es sich befreit aufspielen und wunderbar poetologisieren, über die Bedeutung der Erinnerung für das Schreiben zum Beispiel: »Ein Ereignis ist nicht das, was passiert ist, sondern das, was erzählt werden kann.« – Eine »Anti-Poetologie« – frech, klug und witzig. Wie Kriege dargestellt werden, hat Einfluss auf die Kriegsführung. Das gilt nicht erst für die elektronischen Waffengänge moderner Zeitrechnung.
